What is Involved in Edge Security?



Cloud storage is more affordable than ever, but so are largecapacity hard disk drives. The question becomes

Depending on how your organization's IT infrastructure is set up, there are definitely benefits to having your data storage in-house. First, and most importantly, you know exactly how it is managed, even though you will pay for that. If your business holds sensitive data, whether it be intellectual property or client personal information (financial or medical information especially), you have complete control over how the underlying storage facility is managed.

For compliance-based issues, this is mandatory. Another massive benefit is that you don't need an Internet connection to access the data. This is crucial for organizations that deal with sensitive or personal information.
