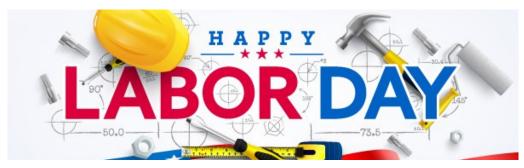

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- All passwords need to be long, more than 14 characters.
- Passwords need to have numbers, capital and lowercase letters, and symbols.
- Passwords can't contain personally identifiable information like birthdays, names, pets, zip codes, etc.
- Each password needs to be unique and not used across more than one account.
- Don't write passwords down on sticky notes, text files, Word documents, or spreadsheets, and

don't trust your web browser to save them for you.
